

ALOHA COMMUNITY LIBRARY ASSOCIATION ANNUAL REPORT OCTOBER 2014

INTRODUCTION

The Aloha Community Library began in early 2011 as the vision of a few friends, neighbors and community activists meeting for coffee to discuss the possibility of a community library in Aloha. From that early beginning a ground-swell of community grass roots activism began, bringing us to where we are today.

OUR PAST

From incorporation in 2011 to opening our doors on September 22, 2012, we solicited and received the generous support of the Aloha-Reedville community, and from many libraries in Oregon, Book donations allowed us to open with a collection of over 6,000 items, and sales of extra donated books provided funding for supplies. Other libraries offered us shelves. furniture, computers, and the checkout counter and bookdrop. Grants allowed us to start a family reading program

in our empty space, before the library was even open. Generous donations from library lovers and local businesses allowed us buy book processing supplies, set up internet access, and to hire our first (and only) paid staff position, the Director of Volunteer Services. In our second year of operation, we moved to a larger space in the same shopping mall, which provided better access, more visibility, larger children's reading area, and greater staffing workspace. With changes to furnishings donated from Pacific University and Garden Home Community Library, we improved our overall look to be more in line with our neighboring libraries that are already part of WCCLS. Our goal was to be part of WCCLS and we were on our way!

OUR PRESENT

Looking back at our second full year in operation, it's amazing to see how much we've grown!

Some of the highlights from this year have been:

October (2013)

- Moved library Annex from facility on TV Highway to former Blockbuster Video building near the library.
- Celebrated 1st anniversary of library's opening at the annual meeting.

November-December (2013)

- Presented special storytime programs in collaboration with the Tualatin Hills Parks and Recreation District's Nature Mobile.
- Library opened during holiday tree-lighting celebration, drawing many new patrons.
- Held 2nd annual Holiday Book-tique, a sale of craft items made by ACLA volunteers.
- Storytime with Santa Claus, with musical accompaniment provided by classical guitarist, Ellen Mickanin.

January

• Promoted Terri Palmer as Interim Library Director.

February

• "Birds of Winter" program held at library.

March

- Spring Book sale held in Annex raised over \$6,000!
- Hired Jesse Castellanos as Library Clerk.
- Library closed its doors and began preparation for move to a new facility just a few hundred yards away.

April

- Opened new library in larger suite space (formerly the National Guard Recruitment Center, next to U.S. World Class Taekwondo).
- Launched spring fundraising drive with a \$15,000 challenge grant.
- Held simultaneous grand re-opening events, including "Taste of Shakespeare" and Olga Loya storytelling event, generously donated by WCCLS.

May

- Little Lambs Too held a jog-a-thon to benefit the Aloha Community Library.
- WCCLS Policy Group approved Aloha Community Library for admission pending approval of library levy in November 2015.
- Aloha Community Library completed spring fundraising drive, exceeding \$30,000 goal by raising almost \$40,000.
- Moved Library Annex (needed for on-line book sales of donated items) from Blockbuster Video facility to portable facility at Mt. View Middle School donated by Beaverton School District.

June

- Summer Reading Program kicked off with an ice cream float party. "Dancing in the Stacks", "Teen Retro Science Fair", and "Dry Ice-Capades" were among many wonderful programs offered.
- Aloha Community Library Association was chosen as the beneficiary of the Annual Charity Raffle at Jan's Paperback Books.

July

 Special programs for all ages were presented by community organizations, including the Washington County Small Animal Shelter, Mad Science, Rose City Astronomers, and a gardening demonstration funded through a grant from the Aloha Garden Club. Programs expand our services to our patrons, going beyond books and media.

August

- "Dr. Who: Silence in the Library" program drew 14 teens for an evening of trivia, costumes, and pizza!
- Other special events included Tualatin Hills Park and Recreation District's NatureMobile program "Trees, Soil and Worms", a visit from "Environmental Toxins & You" author, Dr. Laurel Standley, and the children's summer reading program finale party.
- Community Coffee event hosted at the library in collaboration with the local Beaverton Optimist Club.
- Moved Annex from Mt. View Middle School portable to former Tuesday Morning store location around the corner from the library.

September

- Hired Director of Library Services Erin Barnard.
- Book sale in the new library Annex raised \$6,000!

OUR FUTURE

Looking ahead to 2015, we're focusing on:

- Expanding programs, services and hours
- Growing our budget that will allow increasing staff hours and programs through active fundraising activities
- Continuing to build community and business support and seek grants
- Becoming part of the WCCLS system as a result of the passage of the November 2015
 Library Levy
- Planning for the next library space, even larger than our current space.

Community, Business and Grant Support

Until we become a member of the Washington County Cooperative Library System, we rely 100% on donations, grants, used book sales and fund-raising events to keep the doors open and the internet on.

We will be continuing to work with community groups, businesses and individuals to build the sustaining support that will get us to our goal of WCCLS membership in July 2016.

Passage of the Library Levy in November 2015

We will be proactive in our coordination, planning and collaboration with WCCLS staff and neighboring libraries over the next year. Our belief from the beginning is that Aloha <u>needs</u> a library with a sustainable funding method and we are committed as an organization to see that happen as soon as possible. The passage of a new 5 year library levy for Washington County, which provides about 1/3 of all income to WCCLS member libraries is essential for Aloha to become part of WCCLS. This ballot title will be on the ballot in November 2015, roughly 1 year from now. We need your support to get the word out to help with the passage, which will provide a substantial increase in the funding base for the library.

A FINAL NOTE

Volunteers have given well over 6,000 hours of service in the past year, coordinated and trained by our Director of Volunteer Services, Terri Palmer who also acted in the capacity of Interim Library Director for much of the past year. Terri's dedication, expertise, vision (and patience) have been instrumental to our success as a volunteer-driven organization.

As we move into 2015, our newest staff member, Erin Barnard will be the leader we look towards regarding integration with WCCLS and development of new and interesting programs that encage our community.

The Aloha Community Library has developed a reputation as "The Little Library that Could" because of **your** support, and we need **your** help to reach the goal of WCCLS membership. Specifically, we need:
